





YIYANG LI RECEIVES DARPA YOUNG FACULTY AWARD

Li's research could have significant implications for improving the reliability and functionality of a wide range of electronic devices and systems.

Prof. <u>Yiyang Li</u> has been awarded a 2024 Young Faculty Award from the Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency (DARPA) research project, "Electromagnetic interference (EMI-) resilient nonvolatile memory using oxygen ion devices," "DARPA projects have had very strong track records of innovation, including the development of ARPANET, an early precursor to the Internet," said MSE chair Elizabeth Holm. "We are excited that Prof. Li has the opportunity to follow in those footsteps with this project."

AARON GLADSTEIN (PHD '22) WELCOMES SON EMMETT




