U-M cases remain low despite alarming rise in state

As you've probably heard, the state of Michigan is experiencing a dramatic increase in Covid cases. In fact, it's currently considered a Covid "hot spot." The good news, though, is that cases on campus remain low and account for only 9% of all cases in the county. (It was 62% just a few weeks ago.) Yes, we sound like a broken record, but it's SO important to stay vigilant with all Covid safety precautions, including social distancing and mask wearing - even once you're vaccinated. This coming Monday, April 5, all Michigan residents 16 and older are eligible to

get the vaccine. To help you find a vaccine appointment, U-M has created a <u>COVID-19 vaccine eligibility and availability page</u> with resources to help everyone get an appointment through a clinic, pharmacy, health department or Michigan Medicine. It can be a frustrating process, so, to increase your odds, be sure to sign up everywhere you can.





Departmental response to rising hate crimes against the AAPI community

Over the past few years there has been an escalation in hate speech, hate crimes, and other forms of harassment against members of the Asian, Asian-American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) community in the United States, including the recent horrific attack in Atlanta that resulted in the death of eight people. These words and actions impact not only members of the Asian American community, but also have a profound impact on foreign nationals who are in the U.S. for work, study, and travel.

The Department of Materials Science & Engineering, College of Engineering, University of Michigan categorically condemn these acts of violence and incidents of hate speech. They have no place in our university and no place in our broader society. We are committed to providing a safe, nurturing, and supportive space for all members of the U-M Asian community, whether they be students, faculty, staff, and any other individual who steps onto the campus; we demand they be treated with respect, dignity, and be free from the threat of any and all hate speech and violence. 

MSE stands with College in condemning recent comments made by U-M Regent

As you're most likely aware, last week U-M Regent Ron Weiser made <u>abhorrent</u> <u>comments</u> that sparked widespread outrage and provoked loud calls for him to resign from the U-M board. <u>President Mark Schlissel released a statement Saturday</u>. On Monday Michigan Engineering Dean Alec Gallimore issued a statement (excerpted below) that MSE strongly echoes:

"There is no place for such rhetoric in a civilized society. We must all be vigilant in not only calling out misogyny and the use of violence to settle disputes, but also proactively lifting up the voices of our female community members and providing a supportive environment where all can thrive.

"I fully support our female leaders, staffers, researchers and students, and acknowledge the responsibility we have as engineers to root out misogyny and hate in the University and in society. As Michigan Engineers, we must work together to confront and respond to inequities when we see them."
