


Holi celebration features fun and festive foods

Sounding the alarm: important PSAs about Dow safety

Keith McIntyre, MSE senior facilities engineer, passed along this important information:

- When an alarm goes off in the building, you must assume the alarm is real and not a drill.
- Please listen carefully to the public address system for instructions and follow those directions.

Here are the three types of alarms you could hear and the actions you should take:

Fire Alarms

- Leave the building immediately.
- Either exit the first floor doors and gather in the Grove east of the Bell Tower or exit from the third floor doors and cluster inside the circle of the driveway.
- Move away from the building; do not congregate by the doors.

Severe Weather


 Gather in the main east-west hallway on the first floor outside of the classrooms.

Active assailant

- Remember the mantra Run, Hide, Fight.
- If you can get away safely, leave the area.
- If you do not feel it's safe to leave, shelter in place and barricade yourself in an area farthest away from the threat
- In the worst case scenario, fight with whatever resources you have available.

Solar eclipse event happening this Monday, April 8

A <u>total solar eclipse</u> will cross North America on Monday and all of Michigan will at least get to see a partial eclipse. Here in Ann Arbor, we should experience 98% coverage starting at 1:57 p.m. with maximum coverage at 3:13 p.m. and ending at 4:26 p.m. (See <u>NASA data</u> for zip code 48109 below.) It will be the last solar eclipse visible in the contiguous United States until 2044.
